We use the 'Think' model when we talk to our respect for each other.

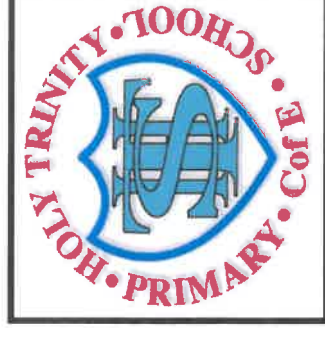
**T** - Think before you speak

## The School

### **We will**

- Carry out a thorough risk assessment to enable us to make what we feel is the right decision regarding a planned reopening (this might vary to other schools).
- Do everything that we can to minimise risk e.g. smaller groupings, staggered drop off and pick up times, staggered break and lunchtimes, alteration of classrooms and use of resources.
- Ensure that our staff maintain a high level of personal hygiene, in particular with regards to handwashing.
- Ensure that we encourage the children to wash their hands regularly and for at least 20 seconds.
- Ensure that a member of school staff sits with your child if they are poorly while we are waiting for them to be collected (please note that school staff will need to wear personal protective equipment [PPE]) at this time.

## The Child

### **I will try to:**

- Continue to follow our school expectations (*to be Ready, Respectful & Safe*) and look after school property.
- Follow the instructions and safety advice given by the adults or information posters around the school.
- Ensure following good hygiene practice of washing hands thoroughly and good respiratory hygiene (ie 'Catch it; Bin it; Kill it').
- Not spit or cough at or towards another person.
- Respect other's right to personal space and try to keep to social distancing guides (ie 2m apart from others).
- Stay within my allocated space or 'bubble' group.
- I will tell a member of staff if I am worried about anything, or if I'm feeling unwell.

## Parent/Carer

### **I will:**

- Understand that even with a variety of procedures put in place to limit risk, social distancing is not possible in a primary school.
- Understand that some of the children that will be in school are the children of frontline staff who are in daily contact with Covid19 patients and, as such, have an increased risk of carrying the virus.
- Stick to the allocated group and related drop off and collection times.
- Make sure that your child only brings a water bottle, their lunchbox, a healthy snack and a coat to school each day.
- Collect your child immediately if your child shows any symptoms of illness at school.
- Collect your child immediately if your child behaves in a way that puts themselves or others at risk; we will be unable to use normal de-escalation techniques or those involving positive handling.
- Ensure that your child comes to clean clothes each day (school uniform if possible) and trainers.
