### In context of our topic

To ask and answer questions

What do we want to learn about lighthouses?

To develop knowledge about the United Kingdom

Look where lighthouses are in UK and locate them

To use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical and human features

Use vocabulary in relation to the location of lighthouses and key physical features, e.g. beach, cliff, coast, sea, ocean, weather

To develop an awareness of the human and physical geography of the area

Use maps, atlases, globes and digital / computer mapping (Google Earth) to locate countries and describe physical features studied

To identify features on a map

Recognise lighthouses as a man made (human) feature, identify where lighthouses are situated

Look at map symbols on ordnance survey map including lighthouses,

To develop an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time

Create a timeline of lighthouses

To know about the history of significant people

Find out about Grace Darling and her achievements

## Vocabulary Half-Dozen

**lighthouse**

A tower or building that shines light from a lamp to guide passing ships and warn them away from rocky coastlines

**coast**

The edge of the land where it meets the sea

**beach**

A sandy inlet on the coast

**cliff**

A steep rock face at the edge of the sea

**sea**

A large area of water that surrounds land

**ocean**

A very large area of water between continents that join smaller seas together
