### Key Vocabulary

Archaeologist	Person who learns about the past by digging up artefacts and studying them
Artefact	An object made by a human being
Agriculture	The process of cultivating land to grow crops and rearing animals for food
Flint	A type of stone during the Stone Age Period, early humans made tools and weapons for hunting
Hillfort	A fort built on a hill with outer walls or ditches for defensive purposes - from Iron Age period
Hunter-Gatherer	To describe early humans who hunted animals and foraged for food (before farming started)
Homo Sapiens	The type of human species today
Monument	Something built to remember an important person or event
Neolithic	Describes a period during the Stone Age where people starting farming
Summer Solstice	Longest Day of the year - links to Stonehenge
Site	A place where a building, town or monument is built - used in the term 'archaeological site'
Winter Solstice	Shortest Day of the year - links to Stonehenge
