Dear Parents and Carers,

What a busy start to the new term it's been!

First of all, thank you for your support during our SIAMs inspection earlier this week, especially those of you who agreed to give up your time to meet with the inspector as part of their timeline of activities. The behaviour, conduct and attitudes of the children were exceptional throughout and the inspector developed a real sense of what a special school Holy Trinity is. Whilst the outcome remains confidential for now, I hope to be able to share the inspection report with you in a few weeks.

Attendance and Punctuality


We have reviewed our current Attendance and Punctuality policy to reflect the changes made by the DfE a few months ago in regard to penalty notices and the expectations of schools to promote and monitor attendance. Our revised policy, which is scheduled to be approved by the governing body, can be found on the school website.

Within the policy, we stipulate that we expect children to attend school 100% of the time. However, I do recognise that illness happens and full attendance isn't always achievable. Having reviewed our current attendance data, there is a significant proportion of children whose attendance is below 96.5% - the current national average, which is the benchmark for most schools. Myself and the rest of the senior leadership team, will be closely monitoring attendance between now and the end of term and will be contacting parents and carers where attendance and punctuality of pupils is a cause for concern. We are committed to supporting our community to ensure all children attend school as much as possible and your support with this will be greatly appreciated.

In the new policy, there is also a greater emphasis on punctuality. As highlighted in the graphic below, every minute counts and regular lateness can have a significant effect on a child's progress and attainment.

Every Minute Counts


If you arrive late to school everyday your learning begins to suffer. Below is a graph showing how being late to school everyday over a school year adds up to lost learning time.



Again, we will be monitoring punctuality closely over the next few weeks and will be contacting parents and carers where punctuality is a cause for concern to offer support.
