# Our Revised Approach to Behaviour at Holy Trinity

We've made some important updates to our behaviour policy to further support a positive and inclusive learning environment at Holy Trinity, which have been summarised below:

#### Our New School Rules

Our behaviour policy is underpinned by our school vision, through which we aspire to provide all children at Holy Trinity with a calm learning environment in which they can flourish socially, academically and spiritually. As such, we expect all children to embody our core values of Love, Courage and Wisdom.

To support this ethos, we have three rules which are referred to consistently throughout the school day:

- Respectful treating others as we wish to be treated.
- Responsible making good choices and accepting consequences.
- Resilient trying our best, embracing challenge, and never giving up.

These rules are consistently reinforced throughout the day and are closely linked to our work on Growth Mindset and Learning Powers, helping children develop strong learning behaviours.

#### Positive Recognition

As a school, we support each other to live by our Christian values to enable us to grow spiritually and develop a brighter future. As children grow and develop, we aim to instil in them a desire to make positive behaviour choices and take responsibility of their own behaviour. To achieve this, we aim to give children constructive and timely feedback to consolidate positive behaviour or support change of inconsiderate behaviour. Feedback may consist of:

- Verbal praise to the child
- Written comment to parents/carers via Class Dojo
- Values certificate in celebration worship
- Sticker from class teacher or SLT
- Awarding of a house point
- Being included in the Gold Book during celebration worship with an invitation to Hot Chocolate Friday with the Headteacher
- In-class incentives and positive recognition strategies

#### Responding to Negative Choices

At Holy Trinity, we promote responsibility by helping children understand the consequences of their choices. All pupils begin each session on 'Green' on the behaviour chart, with a fresh start after every break, lunch, and new day. When a child does not meet our behaviour expectations, a stepped approach is taken across all classrooms. A behaviour chart is used in every classroom to provide a visual reminder for the pupils of the stepped response, aimed at reinforcing our expectations and encouraging the children to improve their behaviour where necessary.

#### Our Step-by-Step Response:

Reminder – If expectations aren't met, staff remind the child of the school rules.

Yellow Card – If behaviour continues, a yellow card is issued and the child's name moves down the chart.

Orange Card - If behaviour continues, an orange card is issued and the child's name moves down the chart. A brief reflective conversation takes place at playtime/lunchtime.

Red Card – If behaviour continues, this will result in a red card and removal from class. The child will complete their work with a member of SLT or Mrs Childs for the rest of the session. A proportionate restorative sanction and/or a reflective conversation will be issued, dependent on the age and stage of the child.

We believe this approach ensures consistency, fairness, and opportunities for children to learn from their choices.

We're pleased to share that our current whole-school attendance stands at 95.9%—a fantastic reflection of our community's commitment to learning.
